Goals for Hardin County Schools

- 1) **Increase achievement in Math and E/LA:** TNReady data from 2023-2024 will be looked at to determine target goals for ELA and Math. ELA and math are an area of need because the achievement level is below prior AMO target; therefore, an increase in achievement is a priority for our school system.
- 2) **Improving Whole Child Supports:** Hardin County Schools works to ensure that each child will be healthy, safe, engaged, supported, and challenged. By May 2025, District-Wide Chronic Absenteeism will decrease from 19.4% to 16.4%.
- 3) **Improving Outcomes of Students with Disabilities by Increasing Performance Percentages of Indicators 3, 5, 7, 8, 11, 12, & 13 and to target goals.**

Hardin County Schools will work to increase Graduation rates, Early Childhood Outcomes, Increase state assessment participation rates and proficiency rates, Increase Acquisition of knowledge, skills and Appropriate behaviors- performance percentages to target goal as well as Increasing post-secondary enrollment in higher education, being competitively employed or engaged in other post-secondary training.

Teachers ~ In the Classroom

Teachers at East Hardin will work with students and families to support student success in all subject areas.

- Have high expectations of our students and ourselves
- Determine the student's educational needs and adjust the instruction to accommodate those needs
- Provide a safe environment
- Give parents reasonable access to staff, volunteer, and participate in school activities and events as health restrictions allow
- Schedule Parent-Teacher Conferences annually to discuss School-Parent compact as it relates to the child's achievement.
- Communicate frequently student progress to parents
